

People

Population: 5,558

- As of 2014, Duquesne's total population was estimated at 5,558.
- The racial/ethnic composition of Duquesne is 51.9% African American and 34.9% white and 13.2% other races—differing from the Jefferson Regional Foundation (JRF) Communities.
- 15% of the total population is over age 65 lower than the JRF Communities (18%). Age 18-64 makes up 56% of West Mifflin and under 18 accounts for 29% of the population—higher than the JRF Communities (20%).
- The median age for Duquesne is 36 and lower than JRF communities (43). The city of Pittsburgh median age is 33 and has decreased since 2000¹.

Public Transportation

JRF Communities: 8.5%

- 17% of population age 16 and over take public transportation to work.
- 42% of Duquesne households do not have access to a vehicle.

Median Household Income

\$19,811

JRF Communities: \$49,773

- On average, 41% of **Duquesne families** have income below the poverty level.
- 73% of those families are single mother families.

College Education

JRF Communities: 26%

- 12% of population 25 years old and over has completed a Bachelor's Degree or higher.
- High school degree is the highest level completed for 46% of residents.

Labor Force

JRF Communities: 63%

- 51% of population age 16 and over isin the labor force.
- The labor force for Duquesne is 50% female, 50% male.

Owner-Occupied Housing

JRF Communities: 70%

- Of the 2,369 occupied housing units in Duquesne, 41% are owner occupied and 59% are renter occupied.
- 33% of total housing units are vacant.

Food Assistance²

JRF Communities: 10%

In 2014, 1,710 residents of Duquesne (31% of the total population) received SNAP benefits.

Overdose³


JRF Communities: 62

- In 2015, 2 residents of the zip code 15110 fatally accidentally overdosed.
- This is an increase from 0 deaths in 2008.

Allegheny County Department of Human Services (DHS) provides human services to Allegheny County residents, including emergency help and long term needs. Below is break down of services provided by DHS by percent of total population. Duquesne is compared with the JRF Communities. Family Support Centers (8%) and Mental Health (7.8%) are the most utilized services in Duquesne.
