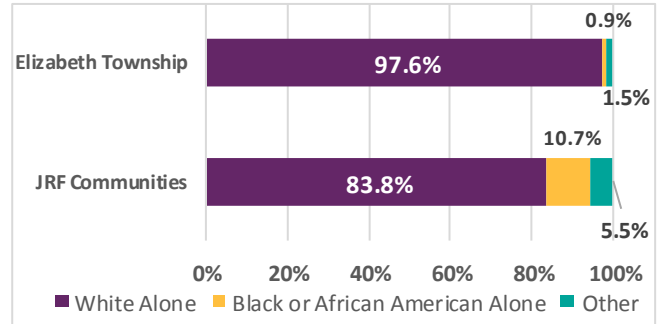

Population: 13,297

Population by Race/Ethnicity (2014)

- As of 2014, the total population was estimated at 13,297.
- The total population is 98% white .9% African American and 1.5% other races.
- 19% of the total population is over age 65 — higher than both Allegheny County (17%) and the City of Pittsburgh (14%). Elizabeth Township residents ages 18—64 make up 61% of the population. Children under the age of 18 account for 20% of the population.
- The median age for Elizabeth Township increased from 43 to 47.¹ This median is higher than other JRF communities (43), and the city of Pittsburgh median age (33).

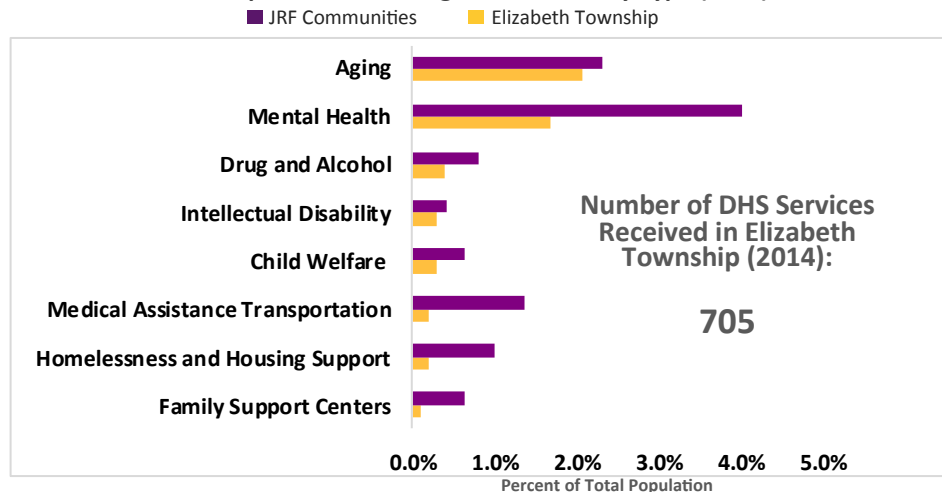

- In 2014, 433 Elizabeth Township residents (3% of the total population) received SNAP benefits.

Allegheny County Department of Human Services (DHS) provides human services to Allegheny County residents, including emergency help and long term needs. Below is break down of services provided by DHS by percent of total population. Elizabeth Township is compared with the JRF Communities. Aging and Mental Health Services were the most utilized for Elizabeth Township, however less percent of the total population accessed Mental Health services than did so for the JRF communities on average.
