

Group quarters includes:

- College/university or seminary student housing (e.g., residence halls or other buildings including apartment-style housing where residents enter into “by the bed” leases, and fraternity or sorority houses recognized by the college or university. One should note that this does not include commuter students, who should be counted at their primary residence)
- Correctional facilities
- Group homes
- Hospitals
- In-patient hospice facilities
- Job Corps centers or vocational training facilities
- Nursing facilities/skilled-nursing facilities (nursing homes)
- People experiencing homelessness and receiving services at service-based locations such as soup kitchens
- Religious group living quarters (e.g., convents, monasteries, and abbeys)
- Residential treatment centers
- Workers’ group living quarters
