<i>Grow, Share, Thrive Campaign</i>	
Provide capital support to renovate and expand the existing facility in Duquesne to meet the increased demand for fresh produce, to serve 200 families/month through a new Model Food Pantry and offer a test kitchen and classroom for cooking classes, and to streamline warehouse operations.
