
Population: 33,577

- The Bethel Park total population increased by 4% from 32,314 in 2010.¹
- The Bethel Park population represents about 16% of the total Jefferson area population.
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, the borough is experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by about 1% from 30,846 in 2010 to 30,434 in 2020, but still remains the area's largest racial group, comprising about 91% of residents.¹
- The Multiracial population grew by 297% and the population • of those identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone* grew by 266% between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.¹
- The median age in Bethel Park Municipality is 48, older than Allegheny County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 18% are under 18 years, 59% are ages 18-64, and 23% are 65 or and older.
