

#### Increasing Diversity in Clairton City Growth in Selected Racial & Ethnic Demographic Populations 2010 to 2020

The population of people who identify as White was 3,914 in 2010 and 2,988 in 2020 for a decrease of 23.7%. The White population is not included in the chart below to maintain readability.



- The Clairton City population represents about 3% of the total Jefferson area population.
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, the city is experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by about 24% from 3,914 in 2010 to 2,988 in 2020, but still remains the area's largest racial group, comprising about 48% of residents.<sup>1</sup>
- The population of those identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone\* and the Multiracial population grew by 154% and 104%, respectively, between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.1
- The median age in Clairton City is 39, younger than Allegheny County (41) but older than the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 22% are under 18 years, 58% are ages 18-64, and 20% are 65 or and older.



<sup>\*</sup>Due to small sample size, we have included individuals identifying as Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, American Indian, or as an identity not listed in the survey ("Other") in People Identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone. Note that racial categories are non-Hispanic.

### **Public Transportation**

- 9% of population age 16 and over take public transportation to work.
- 72% of workers drive alone with avg. commute time of 30 min.

## Median Household Income

- On average, 47% of Clairton families have income below 200% of the federal poverty level (FPL).
- 58% of families under 100% of the FPL are single mother families.

- 16% of population 25 years old and over has completed a Bachelor's Degree or higher.
- This represents a slight increase from 2015 estimates (13%).

# **Labor Force**

- 58% of residents age 16 and over are in the labor force.
- The labor force for the city is 50% female, 50% male<sup>†</sup>.

†The ACS asks only about current sex (male or female), regardless of gender identity or sex at birth.

### **Owner-Occupied** Housing

- 54% of occupied housing units are owner occupied and % are renter occupied.
- 75.5% of housing units are occupied.

Title I (WIOA & WIOA Dislocated Workers) includes services that focus on finding jobs and providing more in-depth services such as training programs for adults and dislocated workers.
