Community

- The Duquesne City School District (DCSD) total population decreased by 6% from 5,565 in 2010.¹
- The DCSD population represents about 2% of the total Jefferson Area population and serves the City of Duquesne.
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, the school district is • experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by 20% from 2,157 in 2010 to 1,733 in 2020, along with the Black Alone and Asian Alone populations (by 3% and 65%, respectively).¹
- The populations identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone* and identifying as Multiracial in the DCSD Communities grew by 165% and 66%, respectively, between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.¹
- The median age for the DCSD community is 30, younger than . Allegheny County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 31% are under 18 years, 58% are ages 18-64, and 11% are 65 or and older.
