
# **Community**

Population: 3,070

- The Forward Township total population decreased by 9% from 3,376 in 2010.1
- The Forward Township population represents about 1% of the total Jefferson area population.
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, the township is experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by about 12% from 3,279 in 2010 to 2,892 in 2020, but still remains the area's largest racial group, comprising about 94% of residents.<sup>1</sup>
- The Multiracial population grew by 367% and the population identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone\* grew by 133% between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson
- The median age in Forward Township is 51, older than Allegheny County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 14% are under 18 years, 63% are ages 18-64, and 23% are 65 or and older.

### Changing Diversity in Forward Township Change in Selected Racial & Ethnic Demographic Populations 2010 to 2020

The population of people who identify as White was 3,279 in 2010 and 2,892 in 2020 for a decrease of 11.8%. The White population is not included in chart below to maintain readability.



\*Due to small sample size, we have included individuals identifying as Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, American Indian, or as an identity not listed in the survey ("Other") in *People Identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone*. Note that racial categories are non-Hispanic.

### **Public Transportation**

All JRF: 7% Allegheny County: 9% City of Pittsburgh: 17%

- 1% of population age 16 and over take public transportation to work.
- 83% of workers drive alone with avg. commute time of 30 min.

### Median Household Income

All JRF: \$57,879 Allegheny County: \$62,320 City of Pittsburgh: \$50,536

- On average, 29% of Forward Twp. families have income below 200% of the federal poverty level (FPL).
- 0% of families under 100% of the FPL are single mother families.

### College Education

All JRF: 30% Allegheny County: 43% City of Pittsburgh: 45%

- 22% of population 25 years old and over has completed a Bachelor's Degree or higher.
- This represents an increase from 2015 estimates (16%).

### **Labor Force**

55%

All JRF: 63% Allegheny County: 65% City of Pittsburgh: 64%

- 55% of residents age 16 and over are in the labor force.
- The labor force for the township is 51% female, 49% male.

†The ACS asks only about current sex (male or female), regardless of gender identity or sex at birth.

### **Owner-Occupied** Housing

All JRF: 71% Allegheny County: 64% City of Pittsburgh: 47%

- 91% of occupied housing units are owner occupied and 9% are renter occupied.
- 93% of housing units are occupied.

## Services Provided in Forward Township

### 1,925 Households received utility assistance from LIHEAP4

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills. Data is from 10/18/2021 through 6/17/2022.

### 1,584 Individuals received transportation assistance through ACCESS<sup>6</sup>

ACCESS is a door-to-door, advance reservation, shared-ride transportation program provided throughout Allegheny County. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.

### 946 Individuals receiving income supports from DHS<sup>3</sup>

Services may include Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid or receive health insurance through HealthChoices. Data is for 2022.

### 13 Homelessness & housing services have been provided by the DHS3

Services are provided by DHS and DHS-contracted providers and include housing assistance, case management, prevention and outreach for individuals and families receiving prevention services, support services and/or housing who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Data is for 2022.

### <Less than 6> Individuals receiving Partner 4 Work services<sup>5</sup>

Title I (WIOA & WIOA Dislocated Workers) includes services that focus on finding jobs and providing more in-depth services such as training programs for adults and dislocated workers. Participants are assigned a case manager and work with that manager to secure an employment position. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.
