
# **Community**

Population: 4,475

- The Glassport Borough total population decreased by less than 1% from 4,483 in 2010, and represents about 2% of the total Jefferson area population.1
- While the total Glassport population has stayed about the same (4,483 in 2010), the borough is experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by about 15% from 4,268 in 2010 to 3,647 in 2020, though it still remains the area's largest racial group, comprising about 81% of residents.1
- The Black Alone population and the Multiracial population grew by 431% and 336%, respectively, between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.
- The median age in Glassport Borough is 41, the same as Allegheny County (41) and older than the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 19% are under 18 years, 66% are ages 18-64, and 15% are 65 or and older.

Increasing Diversity in Glassport Borough Change in Selected Racial & Ethnic Demographic Populations 2010 to 2020

The population of people who identify as White was 4,268 in 2010 and 3,647 in 2020 for a decrease of 14.6%. The White population is not included in the chart below to maintain readability.

### **Labor Force**

- 72% of residents age 16 and over are in the labor force.
- The labor force for the borough is 46.5% female, 53.5% male.

### **Owner-Occupied** Housing

All JRF: 71% Allegheny County: 64% City of Pittsburgh: 47%

- 69% of occupied housing units are owner occupied and 31% are renter occupied.
- 77% of housing units are occupied.

### Services Provided in Glassport Borough

#### 2,654 Individuals receiving income supports from DHS3

Services may include Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid or receive health insurance through HealthChoices. Data is for 2022.

### 514 Households received utility assistance from LIHEAP4

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills. Data is from 10/18/2021 through 6/17/2022.

### 357 Individuals received transportation assistance through ACCESS<sup>6</sup>

ACCESS is a door-to-door, advance reservation, shared-ride transportation program provided throughout Allegheny County. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.

### 107 Homelessness & housing services have been provided by the DHS3

Services are provided by DHS and DHS-contracted providers and include housing assistance, case management, prevention and outreach for individuals and families receiving prevention services, support services and/or housing who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Data is for 2022.

### <Less than 6> Individuals receiving Partner 4 Work services<sup>5</sup>

Title I (WIOA & WIOA Dislocated Workers) includes services that focus on finding jobs and providing more in-depth services such as training programs for adults and dislocated workers. Participants are assigned a case manager and work with that manager to secure an employment position. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.
