Increasing Diversity in the JRF Growth in Selected Racial & Ethnic Demographic Populations


2010 to 2020

• The Jefferson Regional Foundation Communities (JRF) total population increased by 0.3% from 212,328 in 2010 reflecting countywide trends.1

• The JRF region is becoming more diverse. People of color comprise 21% (45,090 residents) of the Jefferson area population in 2020 compared to 14% (29,269 residents) in 2010.¹

- The Asian Alone population in the JRF Communities grew by **267%** between 2010 and 2020.1
- The White Alone population in the Jefferson area decreased by 8% to about 168,000 people from 2010 to 2020, but still remains the area's largest racial group, comprising about 79% of residents.1
- The median age in the Jefferson Communities is 44, older than Allegheny County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 20% are under 18 years, 59% are ages 18-64, and 21% are 65 and older.

The population of people who identify as White was 183,059 in 2010 and 167,951 in 2020 for a decrease of 8.3%. The White population is not included in the chart below to maintain readability.



*Due to small sample size, we have included individuals identifying as Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, American Indian, or as an identity not listed in the survey ("Other") in People Identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone. Note that racial categories are non-Hispanic.

Public Transportation

Allegheny County: 9% City of Pittsburgh: 17%

- 7% of population age 16 and over take public transportation to work.
- 75% of workers drive alone with avg. commute time of 30 min.

Median Household Income

\$57,879

Allegheny County: \$62,320 City of Pittsburgh: \$50,536

- On average, 21% of JRF Community families have income below 200% of the federal poverty level (FPL).
- 55% of families under 100% of the FPL are single mother families.

College Education

Allegheny County: 43% City of Pittsburgh: 45%

- 30% of population 25 years old and over has completed a Bachelor's Degree or higher.
- 94% of population 25 years old and over has completed a high school degree.

Labor Force

Allegheny County: 65% City of Pittsburgh: 64%

- 63% of residents age 16 and over are in the labor force.
- The labor force for the JRF Region is 50%, female, 50% male'.

Owner-Occupied Housing

Allegheny County: 64% City of Pittsburgh: 47%

- Of the 92,229 occupied housing units, 71% are owner occupied and 29% are renter occupied.
- 90% of housing units are occupied.

Services Provided in the JRF Region:

70,351 Individuals receiving income supports from DHS³

Services may include Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid or receive health insurance through HealthChoices. Data is from 1/1/2022 through 8/1/2022.

6,659 Households received utility assistance from LIHEAP4

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills. Data is from 10/18/2021 through 6/17/2022.

5,900 Individuals received transportation assistance through ACCESS⁶

ACCESS is a door-to-door, advance reservation, shared-ride transportation program provided throughout Allegheny County. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.

3,321 Homelessness & housing services have been provided by the DHS³

Services are provided by DHS and DHS-contracted providers and include housing assistance, case management, prevention and outreach for individuals and families receiving prevention services, support services and/or housing who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Data is from 1/1/2022 through 8/1/2022.

179 Individuals receiving Partner 4 Work services⁵

Title I (WIOA & WIOA Dislocated Workers) includes services that focus on finding jobs and providing more in-depth services such as training programs for adults and dislocated workers. Participants are assigned a case manager and work with that manager to secure an employment position. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.
