

Changing Diversity in Liberty Borough Change in Selected Racial & Ethnic Demographic Populations 2010 to 2020

The Liberty Borough total population decreased by 8% from 2,551 in 2010.1

- The Liberty Borough population represents about 1% of the total Jefferson area population.
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, the borough is experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by about 12% from 2,476 in 2010 to 2,172 in 2020, but still remains the area's largest racial group, comprising about 92% of residents.1
- The Multiracial population grew by 465% and the Hispanic population grew by 191% between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.1
- The median age in Liberty Borough is 48, older than Allegheny County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 17% are under 18 years, 62% are ages 18-64, and 21% are 65 or and older.

The population of people who identify as White was 2,476 in 2010 and 2,172 in 2020 for a decrease of 12.3%. The White population is not included in the chart below to maintain readability.



*Due to small sample size, we have included individuals identifying as Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, American Indian, or as an identity not listed in the survey ("Other") in People Identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone. Note that racial categories are non-Hispanic.

Public Transportation

All JRF: 7% Allegheny County: 9% City of Pittsburgh: 17%

- 0% of population age 16 and over take public transportation to work.
- 84% of workers drive alone with avg. commute time of 30 min.

Median Household Income

All JRF: \$57,879 Allegheny County: \$62,320 City of Pittsburgh: \$50,536

- On average, 17% of families have income below 200% of the federal poverty level (FPL).
- 33% of families under 100% of the FPL are single mother families.

College Education

All JRF: 30% Allegheny County: 43% City of Pittsburgh: 45%

- 27% of population 25 years old and over has completed a Bachelor's Degree or higher.
- This represents an increase from 2015 estimates (16%).

Labor Force

All JRF: 63% Allegheny County: 65% City of Pittsburgh: 64%

- 70% of residents age 16 and over are in the labor force.
- The labor force for the borough is 57% female, 43% male.

Owner-Occupied Housing

All JRF: 71% Allegheny County: 64% City of Pittsburgh: 47%

- 77% of occupied housing units are owner occupied and 23% are renter occupied.
- 99% of housing units are occupied.

Services may include Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid or receive health insurance through HealthChoices. Data is from 2022.

214 Households received utility assistance from LIHEAP⁴

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills. Data is from 10/18/2021 through 6/17/2022.

210 Individuals received transportation assistance through ACCESS⁶

ACCESS is a door-to-door, advance reservation, shared-ride transportation program provided throughout Allegheny County. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.

Services are provided by DHS and DHS-contracted providers and include housing assistance, case management, prevention and outreach for individuals and families receiving prevention services, support services and/or housing who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Data is from 2022.
