
Population: 932

Community

- The Lincoln Borough total population decreased by 13% from 1,072 in 2010.1
- The Lincoln Borough population represents about 0.5% of the total Jefferson area population.
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, the borough is experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by about 15% from 1,052 in 2010 to 889 in 2020, but still remains the area's largest racial group, comprising about 95% of residents.¹
- . The population identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone* grew by 1,500% and the Multiracial population grew by 200% between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.1
- The median age in Lincoln Borough is 49, older than Allegheny County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 17% are under 18 years, 62% are ages 18-64, and 21% are 65 or and older.

Changing Diversity in Lincoln Borough Change in Selected Racial & Ethnic Demographic Populations 2010 to 2020

The population of people who identify as White was 1,052 in 2010 and 889 in 2020 for a decrease of 15.5%. The White population is not included in the chart below to maintain readability.

Public Transportation

- 1% of population age 16 and over take public transportation to work.
- 88% of workers drive alone with avg. commute time of 30 min.

Median Household Income

- On average, 12% of families have income below 200% of the federal poverty level (FPL).
- 25% of families under 100% of the FPL are single mother families.

College Education

- 17% of population 25 years old and over has completed a Bachelor's Degree or higher.
- This represents a slight increase from 2015 estimates (14%).

Labor Force

- 66% of residents age 16 and over are in the labor force.
- The labor force for the borough is 40% female, 60% male.

Owner-Occupied Housing

All JRF: 71% Allegheny County: 64% City of Pittsburgh: 47%

- 81% of occupied housing units are owner occupied and 19% are renter occupied.
- 94% of housing units are occupied.
