## **McKeesport City Community Snapshot Issued May 2023**



# Community


Population: 17,727

- The McKeesport City total population decreased by 10% from 19,731 in 2010.<sup>1</sup>
- The McKeesport City population represents about 8% of the total Jefferson area population.
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, the city is • experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by about 25% from 12,132 in 2010 to 9,039 in 2020, but still remains the area's largest racial group, comprising about 51% of residents.<sup>1</sup>
- The population identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone\* and the Hispanic population grew by 56% and 39%, respectively, between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.<sup>1</sup>
- The median age in McKeesport City is 43, older than Allegheny . County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 23% are under 18 years, 57% are ages 18-64, and 20% are 65 or and older.

The population of people who identify as White was 12,132 in 2010 and 9,039 in 2020 for a decrease of 25.5%. The White population is not included in chart below to maintain readability.



### Services Provided in McKeesport City

#### 12,382 Individuals receiving income supports from DHS<sup>3</sup>

Services may include Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid or receive health insurance through HealthChoices. Data is from 2022.

#### 1,408 Households received utility assistance from LIHEAP<sup>4</sup>

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills. Data is from 10/18/2021 through 6/17/2022.

#### 1,250 Individuals received transportation assistance through ACCESS<sup>6</sup>

ACCESS is a door-to-door, advance reservation, shared-ride transportation program provided throughout Allegheny County. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.

#### 942 Homelessness & housing services have been provided by the DHS<sup>3</sup>

Services are provided by DHS and DHS-contracted providers and include housing assistance, case management, prevention and outreach for individuals and families receiving prevention services, support services and/or housing who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Data is from 2022.

#### 40 Individuals receiving Partner 4 Work services<sup>5</sup>

Title I (WIOA & WIOA Dislocated Workers) includes services that focus on finding jobs and providing more in-depth services such as training programs for adults and dislocated workers. Participants are assigned a case manager and work with that manager to secure an employment position. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.
