Community


Population: 10,774

- The Munhall Borough total population decreased by 5.5% from 11,401 in 2010.¹
- The Munhall Borough population represents about 5% of ۰ the total Jefferson area population.
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, the borough is experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by about 13% from 9,883 in 2010 to 8,559 in 2020, but still remains the area's largest racial group, comprising about 79% of residents.¹
- The population identifying as Any Other Single Race ۰ Alone* and the Multiracial population grew by 179% and 141%, respectively, between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.¹
- The median age in Munhall Borough is 49, older than Allegheny County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 18 % are under 18 years, 60% are ages 18-64, and 22% are 65 or and older.

2010 to 2020



Services Provided in Munhall Borough

3,951 Individuals receiving income supports from DHS³

Services may include Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid or receive health insurance through HealthChoices. Data is from 2022.

769 Households received utility assistance from LIHEAP⁴

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills. Data is from 10/18/2021 through 6/17/2022.

653 Individuals received transportation assistance through ACCESS⁶

ACCESS is a door-to-door, advance reservation, shared-ride transportation program provided throughout Allegheny County. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.

199 Homelessness & housing services have been provided by the DHS³

Services are provided by DHS and DHS-contracted providers and include housing assistance, case management, prevention and outreach for individuals and families receiving prevention services, support services and/or housing who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Data is from 2022.

9 Individuals receiving Partner 4 Work services⁵

Title I (WIOA & WIOA Dislocated Workers) includes services that focus on finding jobs and providing more in-depth services such as training programs for adults and dislocated workers. Participants are assigned a case manager and work with that manager to secure an employment position. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.
