
- The South Versailles Township total population decreased **by 11%** from 350 in 2010.¹
- The South Versailles Township population represents about ۰ 0.1% of the total Jefferson area population.
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, the township is experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by about 16% from 340 in 2010 to 286 in 2020, but still remains the area's largest racial group, comprising about 92% of residents.¹
- The Hispanic and Multiracial populations grew by 1,300% • and 700%, respectively, between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.¹
- The median age in South Versailles Township is 54, older ۰ than Allegheny County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 15% are under 18 years, 55% are ages 18-64, and 30% are 65 or and older.

Services Provided in South Versailles

481 Individuals received transportation assistance through ACCESS⁶

ACCESS is a door-to-door, advance reservation, shared-ride transportation program provided throughout Allegheny County. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.
