Steel Valley School District Community Snapshot Issued May 2023



Community

Population: 15,530

- The Steel Valley School District (SVSD) total population decreased by 6% from 16,495 in 2010.¹
- The SVSD population represents about 7% of the total ۰ Jefferson area population and comprises former mill towns Homestead, Munhall, and West Homestead.
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, the school district is experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by 13% from 12,510 in 2010 to 10,837 in 2020, along with the Asian Alone population (by 17%).¹
- The population identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone* and the Multiracial population grew by 122% and 95%, respectively, between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.¹
- The median age for the SVSD community is 43, older than • Allegheny County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 20% are under 18 years, 58% are ages 18-64, and 22% are 65 or and older.

The population of people who identify as White was 12,510 in 2010 and 10,837 in 2020 for a decrease of 13.4%. The White population is not included in the chart below to maintain readability. 

Services Provided in SVSD

6,670 Individuals receiving income supports from DHS³

Services may include Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid or receive health insurance through HealthChoices. Data is from 1/1/2022 through 8/1/2022.

769 Households received utility assistance from LIHEAP⁴

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills. Data is from 10/18/2021 through 6/17/2022.

653 Individuals received transportation assistance through ACCESS⁶

ACCESS is a door-to-door, advance reservation, shared-ride transportation program provided throughout Allegheny County. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.

Title I (WIOA & WIOA Dislocated Workers) includes services that focus on finding jobs and providing more in-depth services such as training programs for adults and dislocated workers.
