

Changing Diversity in Homestead Borough Change in Selected Racial & Ethnic Demographic Populations 2010 to 2020

The population of people who identify as White was 1,015 in 2010 and 804 in 2020 for a decrease of 20.8%. The White population is not included in the chart below to maintain readability.



*Due to small sample size, we have included individuals identifying as Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, American Indian, or as an identity not listed in the survey ("Other") in People Identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone. Note that racial categories are non-Hispanic.

- The Homestead Borough total population decreased by 9% from 3,165 in 2010.1
- The Homestead Borough population represents about 1% of the total Jefferson area population.
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, the borough is experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by about 21% from 1,015 in 2010 to 804 in 2020. The African American and Black Alone population is the largest demographic group, comprising about 60% of the population.1
- The Hispanic and Multiracial populations grew by 62% and 31%, respectively, between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.1
- The median age in Homestead Borough is 31, younger than Allegheny County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total Homestead Borough population, 28% are under 18 years, 52% are ages 18-64, and 20% are 65 or and older.

- 13% of population 25 years old and over has completed a Bachelor's Degree or higher.
- This represents a decrease from 2015 estimates (16%).

Labor Force

- 55% of residents age 16 and over are in the labor force.
- The labor force for the borough is 49% female, 51% male.

Owner-Occupied Housing

All JRF: 71% Allegheny County: 64% City of Pittsburgh: 47%

- 28% of occupied housing units are owner occupied and 72% are renter occupied.
- 72% of housing units are occupied.

2,114 Individuals receiving income supports from DHS3

Services may include Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid or receive health insurance through HealthChoices. Data is for 2022.

769 Households received utility assistance from LIHEAP4

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills. Data is from 10/18/2021 through 6/17/2022.

653 Individuals received transportation assistance through ACCESS⁶

ACCESS is a door-to-door, advance reservation, shared-ride transportation program provided throughout Allegheny County. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.

Services are provided by DHS and DHS-contracted providers and include housing assistance, case management, prevention and outreach for individuals and families receiving prevention services, support services and/or housing who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Data is for 2022.

Title I (WIOA & WIOA Dislocated Workers) includes services that focus on finding jobs and providing more in-depth services such as training programs for adults and dislocated workers. Participants are assigned a case manager and work with that manager to secure an employment position. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.
