

Changing Diversity in Dravosburg Borough Change in Selected Racial & Ethnic Demographic Populations 2010 to 2020

The population of people who identify as White was 1,676 in 2010 and 1,374 in 2020 for a decrease of 18%. The White population is not included in the chart below to maintain readability.



*Due to small sample size, we have included individuals identifying as Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, American Indian, or as an identity not listed in the survey ("Other") in People Identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone. Note that racial categories are non-Hispanic.

Total Population

The Dravosburg Borough total population decreased by 10% from 1,792 in 2010.1

- The Dravosburg population represents about 1% of the total Jefferson area population.
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, the borough is experiencing changing racial demographics. The White Alone population decreased by about 18% from 1,676 in 2010 to 1,374 in 2020, but still remains the area's largest racial group, comprising about 85% of residents.1
- The Black Alone and Multiracial populations grew by 155% and 154%, respectively, between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.1
- The median age in Dravosburg Borough is 49, older than Allegheny County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 12% are under 18 years, 63% are ages 18-64, and 25% are 65 or and older.

Public Transportation

All JRF: 7% Allegheny County: 9% City of Pittsburgh: 17%

- 9% of population age 16 and over take public transportation to work.
- 72% of workers drive alone with avg. commute time of 30 min.

Median Household Income

32,770

Allegheny County: \$62,320 City of Pittsburgh: \$50,536

- On average, 35% of **Dravosburg families** have income below 200% of the federal poverty level (FPL).
- 86% of families under 100% of the FPL are single mother families.

College Education

All JRF: 30% Allegheny County: 43% City of Pittsburgh: 45%

- 15% of population 25 years old and over has completed a Bachelor's Degree or higher.
- This represents a slight decrease from 2015 estimates (17%).

Labor Force

51%

All JRF: 63% Allegheny County: 65% City of Pittsburgh: 64%

- 51% of residents age 16 and over are in the labor force.
- The labor force for the borough is 49% female, 51% male.

†The ACS asks only about current sex (male or female), regardless of gender identity or sex at birth.

Owner-Occupied Housing

All JRF: 71% Allegheny County: 64% City of Pittsburgh: 47%

- 51% of occupied housing units are owner occupied and 49% are renter occupied.
- 89% of housing units are occupied.

104 Households received utility assistance from LIHEAP4

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills. Data is from 10/18/2021 through 6/17/2022.

63 Individuals received transportation assistance through ACCESS⁶

ACCESS is a door-to-door, advance reservation, shared-ride transportation program provided throughout Allegheny County. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.

24 Homelessness & housing services have been provided by the DHS3

Services are provided by DHS and DHS-contracted providers and include housing assistance, case management, prevention and outreach for individuals and families receiving prevention services, support services and/or housing who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Data is from 1/1/2022 through 8/1/2022.

3 Individuals receiving Partner 4 Work services⁵

Title I (WIOA & WIOA Dislocated Workers) includes services that focus on finding jobs and providing more in-depth services such as training programs for adults and dislocated workers. Participants are assigned a case manager and work with that manager to secure an employment position. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.
