

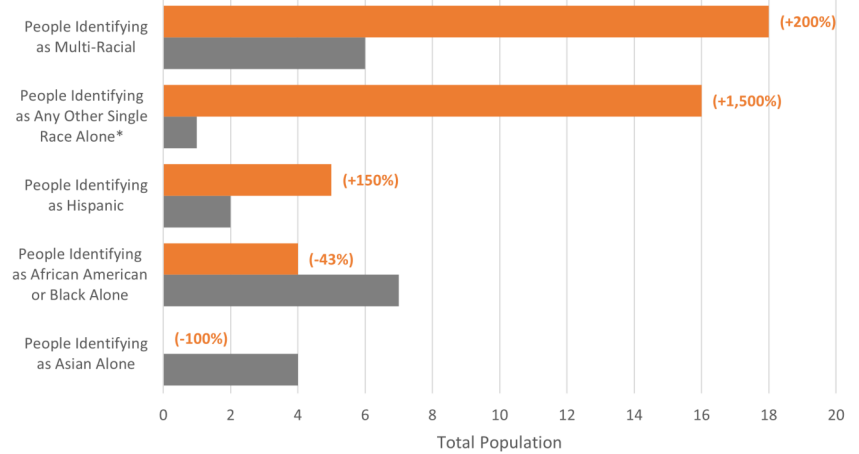
## Community

Population: 932

- The Lincoln Borough **total population decreased by 13%** from 1,072 in 2010.<sup>1</sup>
- The Lincoln Borough population represents **about 0.5% of the total Jefferson area population.**
- Similar to the Jefferson region as a whole, **the borough is experiencing changing racial demographics.** The White Alone population decreased by about 15% from 1,052 in 2010 to 889 in 2020, but still remains the area's largest racial group, comprising about 95% of residents.<sup>1</sup>
- **The population identifying as Any Other Single Race Alone\* grew by 1,500%** and the Multiracial population grew by 200% between 2010 and 2020, reflecting trends in the Jefferson area.<sup>1</sup>
- The **median age in Lincoln Borough is 49**, older than Allegheny County (41) and the City of Pittsburgh (33). Of the total population, 17% are under 18 years, 62% are ages 18-64, and 21% are 65 or and older.

The population of people who identify as White was 1,052 in 2010 and 889 in 2020 for a decrease of 15.5%. The White population is not included in the chart below to maintain readability.

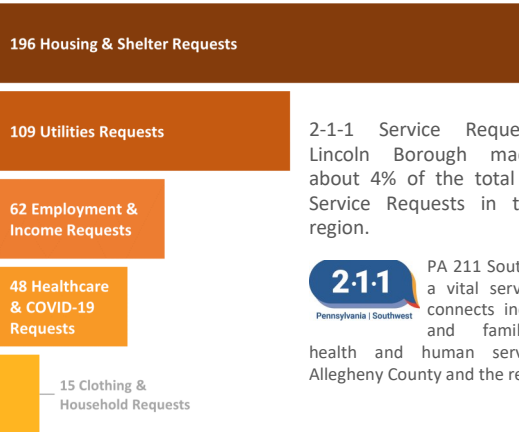

## Service Provided in Lincoln Borough

**582 Individuals received transportation assistance through ACCESS<sup>6</sup>**  
ACCESS is a door-to-door, advance reservation, shared-ride transportation program provided throughout Allegheny County. Data is from 7/1/2021 through 6/30/2021.

**507 Households received utility assistance from LIHEAP<sup>4</sup>**  
The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills. Data is from 10/18/2021 through 6/17/2022.

**215 Individuals receiving income supports from DHS<sup>3</sup>**  
Services may include Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid or receive health insurance through HealthChoices. Data is from 2022.

**<Less than 6> Homelessness & housing services have been provided by the DHS<sup>3</sup>** Services are provided by DHS and DHS-contracted providers and include housing assistance, case management, prevention and outreach for individuals and families receiving prevention services, support services and/or housing who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Data is from 2022.
